



Memory Care Boxes

Mesa Location

- Library card sign-up
- Tailored readers' advisory based on collection
- Items checked out to individual members





Chandler Location

- Encourage book club box
- Bring materials once a month
- Boxes checked out to staff, LP materials checked out to individual members

Robson Reserve Book Club

Who they are

- Assisted Living facility
- Inability to come to the library
- Two different book clubs

How it Works

- Once a month we bring two titles
- Each group receives their own title
- Titles are swapped every two months






Pop-Up Library at Robson Reserve

How it Works

- Every 3 weeks with 30-40 materials
- Take item requests for the next visit
- Help with digital resources
- Create new library cards



Why

- Books by Mail Program will not work
- Inability to come to Library

- Our setup has expanded

Optum

- Run out of a community resource center
- Not always working with facility coordinator
- Lack of communication

- Communication
- Residents unaware of dates and times
